

PREFACE

"Keep a firm grasp on both your character and your doctrine. Don't be diverted. Just keep at it. Both you and those who hear you will experience salvation."

1 Timothy 4:16, The Message

The word theology is derived from two Greek words: "theos" meaning "God" and "logos" meaning "word" or speech. So theology is literally "God-talk." While the word "theology" can carry negative connotations for some, Echo Church is a hub of dialogue about God and His relevancy to the lives of all people.

What we intend to describe here are the theological absolutes (doctrines) that will be used to guide our church. This is by no means a comprehensive theology, as we believe that everything that happens on this earth can be considered to be an issue of theology. Additionally, there may be doctrinal issues with which believers in our community hold divergent views. Controversial issues about which the Bible is silent will be left for individual followers of Christ to sort out on their own, through the Holy Spirit's guidance.

Listed along with our statements are biblical references that serve as the basis for each doctrine.

GOD

God is the center of our theology. We believe there is one God, the God of the Biblical patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The One who created the Universe is all-knowing, all powerful, and present everywhere. We believe in the triune nature of God, in the forms of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, while still existing as One God.

JESUS

We accept the Bible as the final authority that God has given us for faith and living.
